Oyster Class








individual passwords.

A great week. Well done, Oysters!


Seagull Class




Heron Class






















Curlew Class

This week, the children all finished their Zones of Regulation chatterboxes, which they now keep in their trays. The chatterboxes remind them of the 4 coloured zones, the emotions associated with each colour and possible coping



In Geography, we learnt about how the tectonic plates move underneath our feet and how a volcano is formed. The children found out the names of different parts of a volcano and what happens



during and after an eruption. We then had time for an exciting experiment, in which we recreated an eruption by mixing an acid and an alkali together and watching the chemical reaction.





















In RE this term, we are learning why festivals are important to different religions. This week we looked at two videos about the Muslim festival Eid al-Adha. The first was an animation of a character explaining the festival to a friend; and the second was a video of a family getting ready and visiting their local mosque.



The Class will be rewarded with an extra turn on the play equipment.












