

Starfish



This week, the Nursery have been learning about Night and Day. We read the story Day Monkey, Night Monkey and the children spoke about how the sky changes, with the sun coming out during the day and the moon at night. The children have also been very interested in wolves and were excited to find out that they are awake at night time.

We have also been learning about road safety and how to be safe when we cross the road. We must hold an adult's hand, look left and right and listen for traffic to see if it is safe to cross. The children acted this out in the garden, added zebra crossings to their small world play and made their own zebra crossing pictures.

The children have been also supporting the older children with their children in need stalls. It has been lovely to see all the children working together to fundraise.

Well done, Starfish class for another busy week!

Next week, we are going to start learning the Christmas story and start preparing for our Nativity.

Seahorse Class



This week, Seahorse Class have been exploring Space. We began by discovering there are 8 planets in our solar system, and that we live on a planet called Earth. We listened to the stories 'Winnie the Witch in Space', 'Whatever Next!' and 'I want to be an Astronaut' throughout the week.

In Literacy, the children designed their own aliens before labelling different parts of their creations. On the playdough table, the children used their fine

motor skills to make aliens. We watched the moon landing and found out that due to the lack of gravity it was hard to walk on the moon. We then explored different ways of moving to the song 'Zooming to the moon'. As a class we wrote a list of objects we could use

to build a space rocket, before using boxes, material, pots and lids to build space rockets.

In Maths, we have looked at 2D shapes and explored how to describe them using their properties. We then drew around 2D shapes to design space rockets, aliens or the solar system. After an alien stole all the 2D shapes, the children became shape detectives and used their

shape properties knowledge to match


















Oyster Class

This week in Oyster Class, we have been thinking about our friendships and our emotions as a part of Anti-Bullying week. We shared the story of Billy the Bully and thought about how the characters felt at different parts of the story. We talked about our own feelings and how different things can change the way we feel. In ICT, we created a pictogram showing how we were feeling. Each child explained how they were feeling and why as they added their data to the pictogram. It was lovely to hear the children saying they were happy, for so many reasons, (because I am with my friends, because we are learning new things, because I love being in Year 1!) We also had some children who were feeling tired, (because they had been working hard, because they stayed up late for Daddy's birthday and because they had watched Bake Off!)






Also linked to Anti-bullying week, we thought about the people who help us. We discovered that we have so many people who are around to offer us a helping hand. Each of the children created their own 'helping hand' message to give to a friend who had given them a helping hand in the last few days.



In English this week, we have continued looking at the story of the 3 Little Pigs. The children enjoyed using our special headphones to become actors in the story. As part of the immersive experience the children had the chance to build houses like the pigs, blow houses down like the big bad wolf and even move like flames in a fire.





In Maths this week, we have started looking at 3D shapes. The children have been sorting shapes, describing properties and finding examples of shapes around us.






Seagull Class






In English lessons, we have been using our knowledge of dictionaries to learn about thesauruses. The children have described settings and characters using interesting vocabulary. During maths, money was the theme of the week. Most children have recognised coins and can

add two amounts together and find change from £1. Well done! During art and science, the children have created a finger-painting picture of Monet's garden and investigated waterproof materials using toys. Another fantastic week, Seagulls!



It's been another successful week in Year 4.




act out a story. We then used this experience to inform our writing.


We watched the BBC live lesson about bullying and what to do if you are being bullied or see bullying going on. Then the children designed their own antibullying posters.

In maths, we have been revising prime numbers, factors, squared and cubed numbers.


This week, as a school, we have focused on anti-bullying. The children had an amazing time at the fun run, helping and encouraging the younger years. We joined in with the


BBC bitesize live anti-bullying lesson and produced beautiful posters and friendship paper chains.






Avocet Class



This year's theme is 'One Kind Word', and it was introduced to the children during Monday morning's assembly. The children were shown a presentation, which included a video of children explaining the importance of using kind words, as well as giving lots of examples. Then, the children were given a (very) long list of people who they could turn to at school if they feel they are being bullied. This included teachers, teaching assistants, the Year 6 anti-bullying ambassadors and the wonderful Mrs Wilson. Finally, the children listened to the official 'One Kind Word' song (https://www.youtube.com/watch? v=3Jxkc1T8YZM).

On Tuesday, the whole school came together for a fun 'run' on the field. Although, it turned out that not a lot of running took place! Instead, the children used it as an opportunity to dance, play and conga together. It was lovely to see all year groups interacting so happily. We then all went into the hall for some dancing. Highlights included Mrs Waite impressing everyone by excelling at the Macarena and a whole school rendition of 'Happy Birthday' sung to Mrs Emmings.

Lots of different activities have been running in classes throughout the week. Junior classes had the opportunity to watch a 'live' lesson with actors portraying the different roles in bullying situations. This also reinforced the training completed last term by the anti-bullying ambassadors, which encouraged you to be an up-stander, not a by-stander. Lots of children designed anti-bullying posters and other fabulously creative ways to promote using kind words.








Bravember






