Starfish Class

This week, Starfish class have been learning about the season, winter. We have been reading the book called 'The Magic Sky' and talking about animals that like to live in cold countries. Our small world area was made into a winter scene and the children played with Polar bears, penguins and snowflakes.

The children also explored the ice and helped the snow animals to escape from the giant ice cubes. The children were able to talk about how the ice was melting because it was getting warm in the classroom and because they were breaking it into small bits.

Outside in the garden, the children have also had fun building dens with sheets, pegs and crates. They learnt to work together as a team to achieve a common goal.

They also did some acting using Now, Press, Play, where the children wore headphones and listened to the instructions to help them act out the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. The children listened carefully to the story and pretended to be Baby Bear and Goldilocks. They all listened well and enjoyed the activity.

Next week, Nursery will be learning about why we celebrate Christmas and what to we do to celebrate Christmas.

Seahorse Class

This week in Seahorse Class, we have been exploring Road Safety and Nocturnal Animals as our topics. We began the week by experiencing Now Press Play – where each child had their own set of headphones and listened to an interactive story. The children listened to a space story and later in the day listened to a story about a trip to the beach. This story led into our Road Safety topic. After the story we discussed how to cross a road safely and who could help us to cross a road. The children then practised crossing a pretend road in our classroom following the Stop, Look, Listen rules. On the mark-making table, the children drew Lollipop men and women, traffic lights, and stop signs.

Later in the week, we listened to Owl Babies. We noticed the owls were awake throughout the night in the story and discovered the word nocturnal described all animals who were active at night. The children used paint to create a picture of an owl inspired by Owl Babies. As a class we then researched other nocturnal animals and found they included: foxes, badgers, tarantulas, bats. and night monkeys!

In Literacy, the children have discussed what an invitation is used for and which written information would be included. The children then began to write an invitation for their Christmas performance. On the playdough table, the children have been making cakes, biscuits and sweets for a range of parties after our discussion on invitations.

As the weather has turned colder, the children investigated ice blocks which had animals frozen inside. The children used different tools to try and release the animals and noted the ice began to melt and turn to water.

In Maths, the children looked at different ways to represent numbers from 1 to 10, using toys, writing numbers, dots and each other. We have also been exploring number sequences by looking for missing numbers from 1 to 20 using number tiles. Later in the week, the children began to match quantities to numerals.









Oyster Class






In Maths lessons this week, we have been looking at 2d shapes. We named and described shapes, found examples of them around us and created shape pictures. We also explored repeating shape patterns.

In DT lessons we have designed new houses for the pigs and created individual model houses with opening doors.










Seagull Class

They thought about the fictional 'Tectonic Town' (named by Arthur) and played the 'Great British Quake Off' game. They also watched an interesting example of lava flow and how it cools down, using melted wax poured over a model.






Avocet Class



What you need to do:

- Research primary schools that you are interested in by, for example, viewing information on their website especially for new pupils; if they have an open evening try to visit the school, look up information on the Department for Education website.
- Access the Primary Admission Booklet on the website
 - (available from 14 September). All relevant information is available in the booklet and on the website. A look up table using your postcode or address details is available on the website for searching your catchment school.
- Submit an application to the Council expressing your preferences.
- The admission round is between 14 er 2021 and 15 Jan 2022. Applications can be made online or in hard copy and are coordinated by Southend-on-Sea Borough Council.
