Starfish

Well done Starfish class for another busy week leading up to Christmas! The children have been wrapping presents at our wrapping station and putting them under the tree. Some children have been dressing up as Father Christmas and delivering presents and other children have had fun unwrapping the boxes! For our Maths we looked at the size of the presents to see if they are big or small.

We are also very proud of the children performing at their Nativity. They sang really well and remembered the actions. Thank you to all the parents that came and for joining in with us. It was lovely to see the parents and children spending time with the Nativity farm animals.

On Friday we had a special visit from Enzo the Elf. We went on a little run with him to keep us fit and healthy.

Seahorse Class

This week, Seahorse Class has continued to explore Christmas. We began the week by listening to the story 'A letter to Santa' by Gaby Goldsack, which opened with a little boy writing a letter asking Santa for presents. In Literacy, the children wrote their own letters to Father Christmas. They used a toy catalogue to cut out pictures, before independently writing or rainbow writing the items and their names.

On the mark-making table the children have been creating their own toy lists, decorating angels and fairies, creating panto tickets, making puppets inspired by the pantomime and writing programmes for Aladdin.


As the diva lamps are now dry, the children have used paint and glitter to decorate them, before posing for a picture with their creations. We have also used paint to create a calendar for 2022.

On Wednesday, the children were extremely excited to go to the pantomime, Aladdin. Before we went, we discussed what a pantomime was and found out it takes place in a theatre. We investigated Southend and discovered our local theatres are the Cliffs Pavilion and Palace Theatre. The children enjoyed the interactive pantomime and it was lovely to see them laughing.

In Maths the children have been looking at the concept of whole and parts. We have explored that whole things are often made up of smaller parts and that a whole is, therefore, bigger than its parts. To investigate this concept, we began by looking at toys such as puzzles, Mr Potato Head and marble run which need parts to be whole. This led onto looking at numbers, where we found that a number can be decomposed and composed into smaller parts. The children look at how the number 3 could be decomposed and composed of different parts e.g., 1 and 2, 1 and 1 and 1, 2 and 1 using blocks before drawing representations on a white board.

Thank you to all the parents and carers who attended our Nativity on Thursday. We are very proud of the children's performance; they have been practising very hard and were eager to show off their singing and actions.

This week, we have been getting into the Christmas spirit. We have learnt a new fact each day from our Christmas Around the World Advent calendar, which tells us about a variety of traditions.








In English lessons, we have been learning about letters linked to the book Dear Father Christmas. We have explored the features of a letter and we received a letter from our elf, Twinkle.




In Maths lessons this week, we have been looking at place value of numbers up to 20. We used the inequality symbols to compare groups of objects and numbers.

which materials would keep the pigs dry.








Seagull Class



























Curlew Class



We have recently moved our Individual Provision Plans (ISP's) to our online system (EDUKEY), meaning that you were able to access your child's ISP and comment on this from home. Thank you to those parents/carers who have accessed this online. Your comments are vital when discussing your child's provision and arrangements to support them in school. If you haven't had the opportunity to do so, please follow these simple steps below:

To set this up, you were given a unique access code attached to this guidance for you to log in with. You first need to set up an account to gain access – below are the steps to follow to do this.

Go to www.edukeyapp.com/parents

You will have to enter your email address, the access code and your child's date of birth.

Tick the small box that says I don't have an account.

You will then be asked to enter further personal details.

This will then create an email sent to you to verify your email address. When you have completed this, you will then be able to log into your parent account and view your child's ISP.

At the bottom of the document is a comments box for you to add your parent comments in which will be included on your child's ISP.




