We watched videos to investigate people's jobs in both the Lego industry

We then created our own Lego characters, which we then turned into basic comic book animations. We have learned the key skills needed to be successful within the creative industry. These are: listening, presenting, problem solving, creativity, staying positive, aiming high, leadership and teamwork. All these skills are important and key elements of success.











### Curlew Class

On Tuesday afternoon, we participated in an interschools workshop run by 'My Future, My Southend'. During this, we learned about various jobs within the creative industry, as demonstrated by 3 volunteers, and also had the chance to ask questions directly to the volunteers. We also had the opportunity to mime creative jobs for the rest of the class to guess. This has all fed in perfectly to our sound/animation topic and given us fantastic ideas ahead of creating our own animations (which we

started doing the following day).







In PSHE, we have continued to explore emotions and considered how feelings can be represented by colour, well known phrases, imaginative images and even temperature. We also looked at pictures to describe the emotions they evoked, as well as finding adventurous synonyms for common emotion words. The children then each had a different emotion word and a picture of a body outline. They decided on colours, patterns, pictures and settings to pictorially represent the emotion. Other children then had the opportunity to guess the emotion by the way it had been illustrated.

As usual, it has been a very busy week. I am very proud of each and every member of the class and hope everyone has a relaxing and fun weekend before we do it all again next week.


## **Avocet Class**

Please continue to water it and let us know when it grows!



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# Oyster Class

#### **First**





This week, Oyster Class have been exploring instructions. We began the week with a cold task of writing instructions for how to wash our hands. As we build up our knowledge on instructions, we will re-write this piece of work.

Following this, we drew pictorial instructions on how to make a magic hat. Our magic hats included the silver rays of the moon, a unicorn's horn, a dragon's tooth, the snot of a giant and the song of a mermaid. To help us remember the sequence of the instructions, we added time connectives and actions. Finally, we have looked at imperative (bossy) verbs and how they are needed to write instructions.

#### Next





In ICT, the children followed numerical instructions to paint the sections of a bird with the corresponding colours.

In RE, we explored Christian symbols and what they denote within the faith. The children then designed symbols to represent what was important to them.

In Science, we have used our observation skills to identify what type of weather has occurred each day, in the morning, at lunch and in the evening. We also listened to different weather sounds when using Now Press Play.


In Maths, we have looked at part, part whole using bar models. The children then identified the addition and subtraction calculations that could be written from the bar model.

In PSHE, we explored how germs can be transferred, by placing glitter on one child's hand and seeing how far the 'germs' travelled in the classroom. This led to a discussion of why it is important to wash our hands. During this discussion, we talked about the different instructions we could give to help someone who did not know how to wash their hands.



### **Heron Class**











This week Year 3 have been working hard on finding different methods to divide 2-digits by 1 digit. They have used Base 10 and multilink to share and divide into groups and show what happens when you cannot make equal groups and have a remainder. Some moved onto using partitioning as a method to divide, while others used their place value columns and drew Base 10.

In English, they have begun exploring explanation texts and the difference between them and instructions. They have written instructions on 'How to Make the Perfect Teacher' and looked at time adverbs and conjunctions which will be useful for explaining. They have also started reading our next class text 'George's Marvellous Medicine' by Roald Dahl, which I am definitely enjoying reading to them!

In their Geography lesson, the children used atlases to locate and label the different countries in the UK and a variety of cities around the United Kingdom. I was so impressed by their Geographical knowledge and how quickly they found all the different cities :

This week in Seagull class, we have written our own explanation texts for going on holiday to Kenya. We used time connectives and interesting vocabulary to plan a trip.


In maths, we have continued our understanding of division and used our reasoning and problem-solving skills.


In geography, we went outside and used compasses to understand


direction. This will support us when we make our own maps of the local area.
