
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### **Avocet Class**




Welcome back! Year 6 have returned refreshed from their Easter break and are ready to work hard for their final term at Hinguar.  $\Box$

### Curlew Class



It has been lovely to welcome back the children for our penultimate half term together. They all seem to have grown over the past two weeks and look tanned and healthy from our recent good weather.


This week, we have ploughed straight into our new topic of Emperors and Empires by observing where the Ancient Romans and Ancient Greeks fit into a world history timeline spanning from the stone age to present day. We then sequenced key events from the Ancient Roman era in chronological order. The children have heard the myth of Romulus and Remus, summarised the story and sequenced key points. We also discovered that the anniversary of the foundation of Rome is on Thursday of this week! We will continue to look at this story in more depth over the next couple of weeks to analyse the text, use descriptive language to describe characters and settings, and then eventually rewrite in our own words.

In RE, we learnt about why we recently celebrated Easter and why the events in the Holy week leading up to Easter Sunday are important to Christians.

We have also been revising French numbers ahead of learning days of the week and months of the year in French. Children watched YouTube videos which consisted of catchy songs to practise counting in French, and then

had the opportunity to play games matching and sequencing French numbers in the computer suite. All the class have settled back into school seamlessly and have worked hard.

Jessica performed at the Towngate Theatre in the Junior Masters Performance.













### Seahorse Class







In Literacy, the children designed a mode of transport which could take them around the world. Some children combined different parts of vehicles to make their own mode of transport. Some combinations included: a van with butterfly wings, a rocket boat and an air balloon train. One child decided their mode of transport would be a tortoise! The children then wrote a sentence about their vehicle.

The children were both excited and nervous to start their swimming lessons with Kris the swimming instructor. The children tried hard with changing their clothing, before entering the pool and drying themselves with a towel when exiting the pool. All children showed great confidence to enter the water and listened well to Kris. Do not forget that swimming is now on a Thursday.



When researching Albania and Romania, we tried to learn some of the language. The children practised saying hello, goodbye, please and thank you. We also listened to a nursery rhyme Arbër vlla-e Albanian and a nursery rhyme Micutul Păianjen in Romanian. In Music, Miss Kent introduced the children to some traditional folk music from both countries.

The children discovered that Transylvania was in Romania, and this is where Count Dracula and his bats lived! We discovered the Albanian flag has a red background with a black double-headed eagle in the centre, the red represents bravery and strength with the eagle being a symbol of significance. While the Romanian flag has 3 colours, blue which represents liberty, yellow is justice and red represents the country.

In Maths, we looked at addition using the terms first, then and now, for example **first** we have 1, **then** we add 3 so **now** we have 4. To demonstrate this concept, the children became passengers waiting for a bus. We used chairs to create a bus which stopped at 2 bus stops to pick up passengers. Following on from this, the children used multi links to complete the addition sums before writing them down.










# Heron Class

Outside the children have been playing with the diggers in the big sandpit and extending our learning of pushing and pulling. We have also been learning about Bessie Coleman, who was the first female, black African pilot. The children spoke about if they had been on a plane and their experience.

Next week we will be looking at the story Duck in a truck.








### Awards and Notices

# Seagull Class








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# Oyster Class




We have had a lovely first week back this week. On Wednesday we went on a trip to Hyde Hall where we completed a range of activities linked to plants and growth. The children talked about how plants are used to make food and clothes. They enjoyed seeing finished products such as cotton clothes and chocolate bars and how they started off as a cotton plant or a cocoa pod.



We then went out for a scavenger hunt around the grounds, collecting fallen leaves, catkins, petals and sticks. We sorted the items we had collected and used our favourite items to make sticky bookmarks.


