We hope that you will be able to join us on that day to cheer the children on.





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






Curlew Class



Last Friday, Year 4 completed the level 1 Bikeability training. Firstly, they were taught how to correctly fit and wear their helmet and were reminded of the importance of always wearing one. Next, they learnt about basic safety checks they needed to do to ensure their bike is safe to ride. Once this had been covered, the rest



of the time was dedicated to riding. The children concentrated on being able to control their bike when riding and to be aware of their surroundings.

The children behaved impeccably well and were fantastic representatives for our school. I was particularly impressed with the group I was working with, who were not as confident riding a bike at the start of the session, but persevered and improved immensely over the short period of time. I am proud of every member of the class for such fabulous riding and behaviour.

This week, the children have finally rewritten the story of Romulus and Remus in their own words. We spread the story over 4 days to ensure that each part could be written in detail and include interesting and descriptive vocabulary. On Friday, we worked on combining all 4 parts,

along with illustrations, to recreate the whole story.

We also continued our History topic by starting to look at ancient Roman mosaics and creating our own representations. Check out next week's newsletter for pictures!

In Science, we have continued to learn about our teeth. We learnt what a human tooth is made up of and carefully drew our own diagrams and labelled them appropriately. We also considered the function of each part of the tooth.

In RE this half term, our focus is learning about why Jesus is inspiring to some people. We initially explored what the term 'inspiring' means and last week watched a video to illustrate gualities of being inspirational



Well done fabulous Year 4, for another fantastic week.



School dinners need to be ordered and paid for in advance on the IRIS Parent Mail app.

School dinner menus will be published weekly for the following week to be ordered and paid for on the Parent Mail app. Universal and Free School Meal children will still need to order their choices on the Parent Mail app **but will not be charged.**

To order, open the IRIS Parent Mail app and go to accounts. In accounts there is the School Dinner Register, tap on this to open the School Dinner Register and tap one of the days. This will take you to the screen with the menus for the week where you can order your choices for the individual day or full week.





Seahorse Class





This week, we have been exploring the country Egypt. After locating Egypt on the map, we discovered it was in the continent of Africa. We researched Ancient Egypt and found that the river Nile ran through the country. We discussed what the Egyptians may use the water for, ideas included: to fish, to transport items, to help with

farming and to drink. The children looked at the pyramids of Giza and the sphinx and were amazed at how big each monument was. They enjoyed discovering the pyramids had secret tombs and were often booby trapped to stop people stealing the pharaoh's riches. The children were fascinated by camels; we learnt the name of a single humped camel was a Dromedary, a camel with 2 humps is a Bactrian and that the humps stored fat not water as the children had previously thought.

In Literacy, the children drew a treasure map and labelled areas on it. To begin this activity they stained the paper with tea. After designing their

treasure maps, we discussed what we would like to find in the treasure chests. Some ideas included: chocolate coins, a book, a cake and a puppy!

This week, the Super Writing Capes were introduced to the class. These capes can only be worn if the children are writing or drawing. The capes give the children special superpowers to help with their work.

On the mark-making table the children have been drawing pictures of their treasure, creating pyramids and designing Egyptian pharaoh masks and collar necklaces. They were able to see and feel some Egyptian artefacts and were very gentle when handling them.



In Maths, we have been looking at counting on from a given number, rather than starting from 1. This skill will aid the children's understanding of addition. We have used number lines and tiles to physically move our bodies as we count on. The children then went onto solve addition sums starting with the first number and counting on. Our Year 5 helpers played different boards games with the children, so



they could practise their counting skills.

Recycle, Repurpose, Reuse








Oyster Class








This week, we have started looking at fractions. We explored a variety of shapes and found half in different ways.

In Our English lessons this week, we have continued looking at persuasive writing. We have made links to our PSHE work which is thinking about our environment and how we can protect it. We have been working together on a piece of persuasive writing about the importance of recycling.







Seagull Class





This week in Seagull class, we have written a persuasive letter and used lots of expanded noun phrases and conjunctions. In maths, we have learnt about position, direction and shape by rotating shapes and describing how they have changed. For topic this week, we watched videos about Lyme Regis and how it has changed over the past 200 years. We had great fun finding the physical and human features of the coastline and discussed why Lyme Regis is now such a popular destination (because of all the fossils!). In science, we started an investigation to see how long ice melted in two different conditions. One tray was open to the elements and the other was covered in cling film to replicate greenhouse gases. We are learning lots of new vocabulary this term and exploring ways of helping to protect and save our environment. Our swimming skills are improving as we are continuing to have lessons on a Wednesday. There are lots of smiling faces and great perseverance from everyone in these lessons. 



Outside, the children made a bus out of the crates and tyres and took turns buying tickets and riding on the bus.






Then for Maths we have been looking at shapes. The children named the shapes and decorated a bus with them.
