







Hinguar have been nominated to be part of the Asda Foundation Green Token Giving online vote through your local Asda store, Shoeburyness.



Seahorse Class





Welcome back, Seahorse Class

This week, we have travelled to Japan. We have looked at the culture comparing it to ours. We also listened to the story Suki's Kimono.

In Literacy, the children have been writing silly sentences and practising hard with their phonics.

In Maths, the children have been exploring doubling by rolling a dice and counting the number of spots twice. They have also been practising their number formation.

On the mark-making table, the children have coloured a variety of Japanese inspired pictures, they have also explored how to paint with watercolours, before painting pictures inspired by Hokusai's The Great Wave.

Throughout the week, children have also been cleaning dinosaurs, creating origami, playing hairdressers and building houses.

Oyster Class








This week in Oyster Class, we have been completing our phonic

Seagull Class







Your messages are stored and can be seen by other healthcare staff who follow the same confidentiality rules. We aim to reply to you within one working day and you should get an immediate bounce-back to confirm we received your text. Texts will not be seen outside of normal working hours. If you need help before you hear back from us, contact a member of school staff or your doctor. Our text number does not receive voice calls or MMS picture messages. We support messaging from UK mobile numbers only (which does not include messages sent from landlines, international mobile numbers and some 'number masking' mobile apps). Prevent the school nurse from sending messages to you by texting STOP to our number. Messages are charged at your usual rate.
