






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Curlew Class

First, they followed a You Tube tutorial to create a mosaic pattern using squared paper and specific colours. They then made their own mosaics using glass tiles and clay.



In science, we have been learning about the digestive system.


The children labelled these, had the opportunity to handle the internal organs models and used large books to help identify the key parts.


We wish Mrs Hamblin all the best in her new role and thank her for all her hard work and dedication to Hinguar.







Seahorse Class



Avocet Class














Oyster Class






This week, we have been developing our dictionary skills. We have discovered how to



Please contact the office if you need to be re-sent your invitation code or to reset you PIN.









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
Seagull Class




In our small world area, the children were playing with a campervan, looking at what it would be like to stay in a caravan and discussing with the teachers how it is different to staying in a tent.

<u>Summer Term - Individual Support Plans</u>

If your child has an Individual Support Plan (ISP) with SMART targets, to support them with their additional needs, your child's class teacher in the week beginning of the 4th July will be sharing these documents with you. Mrs White will be holding a 'drop in' session on Monday 4th July 2022 at 2 o'clock. This will give you an opportunity to log on to Edukey and see electronically your child's plan and speak to the SENCO about any further information.



SMART Targets

We set targets for children with SEND so that staff, parents, and children know what we are all working towards.

These targets are part of a child's Individual Support Plan (ISP). We include SMART targets in our ISP. SMART targets are:

- \checkmark Specific: We say exactly what the next small step will be for the child.
- ✓ Measurable: We say how we will know if the child is meeting the target.
- ✓ Achievable: We will be ambitious for the child, but it still needs to be achievable.
- ✓ Relevant: We link it to the child's difficulties or what they need to achieve next.
- √ Time bound: Targets are normally set to for one term (10-14 weeks).

How are Targets Specific?

Specific targets say what the child will be able to do. We avoid words that are vague. Instead, we use action words to write targets (e.g., read, write, take turns).

<u>Edukey</u>

Parents and families will receive a code to access their child's Individual Support Plan on 'Edukey'. They can find an online ISP document. Class Teachers will provide a paper document during parent consultations and additional ISP meetings.


The school encourages families to go online to access their child's ISP and leave feedback to fully be part of the ISP process.



Excellent week all.


