Parent Communication Workshop Feedback

Thank you to the parents who either attended or emailed their feedback/comments regarding Communication for the parent workshop, yesterday afternoon. The workshop was in response to some of the comments made in our parent survey towards the end of the summer term. The discussions that were had were very positive and helpful. We have attached to this week's newsletter a leaflet showing how we currently communicate and below is a precis of what was discussed.



Twitter

All schools in SECAT have Twitter accounts which all parents are able to follow. You don't need a Twitter account to do so. Our Twitter account is @HinguarSchool. Please follow us and SECAT for in the moment postings.

MCAS

Parents reported that the app is easier to use rather than accessing via emails, so please download the app for ease of use. The move to greater electronic communication was greatly appreciated.

Personal information ie change of mobile numbers, change of address etc can be updated by you through the app and it will send an alert to the school office for them to accept the update. This replaces us having to send out the data update sheets at the beginning of each academic year.

Newsletters/letters

New key dates added to the newsletter will be written in red each week. Known dates for the remainder of the year will be shared so that parents can make plans to attend.

Some separated parents have stated that they don't always see the newsletters/letters as they are not always the first contact. MCAS now allows any parent who has parental rights, and is not subject to a court order, non-access order or anything similar, access to their child's account. Please contact the school office for further details.

Curriculum Letters

Parents commented on how useful the curriculum letters are in terms of what the children are studying each term but asked for further guidance around reading book levels and how well their child is doing with this. Discussions took place around having a dedicated page in the home/school diary to identify which reading level the children are. This will be added to next year's Home/School diary. Also, holding curriculum evenings where staff are able to talk about the expectations for each core subject/year group. These will be taken back to staff over the next few weeks and we will update you of the outcome of our discussions in due course.

Seahorse Class







We began the week in Seahorse Class with parents/carers and children experiencing lunch together. They

enjoy ed a tasty lasagne before having yoghurt, fruit or jelly for dessert. The children then carefully tidied their trays away. From Tuesday, the children came and explored the classroom, settling independently. On Wednesday, the children looked extremely smart in their school uniform. We have enjoyed stories such as 'The Colour Monster goes to School' and 'Harry and the Dinosaurs go to School' and explored how we have all felt before and during school. The children have learnt to say stop when someone is doing something they do not like. We have also been learning the rules of the class and how to walk around the school. In the classroom, the children have made food from playdough, constructed marble runs, used magnifying glasses to find bugs and role-played making houses and dens. 







Sanderling Class


In Maths, we have been identifying and writing numbers to 1,000,000. We have also learned and solved Roman numerals to 1,000.











Avocet Class

Well done ,everyone for an amazing week. Good luck wishes to all the Year 6 children who are taking their 11 Plus exams this weekend.








Seagull Class


Heron Class


















Oyster Class


