Do NOT forget the children begin PE on Monday, so please send them into school in their PE kits.








Avocet Class

Dessert: : Jelly, Fruit Jam Doughnut or Sugar Ring Doughnut








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Oyster Class

This week, we started learning about volcanoes, labelling cross section pictures and considering how the volcanoes are formed. We then demonstrated how the pressure under the earth causes a volcanic eruption by creating a chemical reaction between an acid and an alkali to simulate magma bursting through the earth. The classroom had a distinctly vinegary smell after this!

In ICT, we continued learning about internet safety. We revised what is meant by 'phishing' and considered the negative effects of malware and computer viruses.

In RE, we are learning about how life could be seen as a journey, and specific milestones we encounter along the way. The children worked as a team to order 34 pictures which summarised the life of Queen Elizabeth II, to celebrate her life and notable events she experienced.

In PSHE, we considered 'breaking down barriers', and each individual's personal strengths and talents; and set achievable goals to work towards during the school year ahead.









Seagull Class

This week in Starfish class, our story focus has been 'We Are All Different'. We have been celebrating similarities and differences between ourselves and each other.



Play Equipment


