
# Autumn Term Newsletter Week 4 30th September 2022

# Seahorse Class




# Sanderling Class









Once again, Year 5 have

worked very hard this week. In English, we have been working extremely hard to develop our vocabulary, using thesaurus's. We have used our new, enriched vocabulary when writing expanded noun phrases,

personification, metaphors, which we will include in poems inspired by the sea.

We were extremely lucky, this week, to go to Southend Museum to take part in our first of three Anglo Saxon workshops. The children spent the first half of their trip studying the museum exhibits and discovering how the Anglo Saxons lived, dressed and the weapons used in battle. The children also used the timeline around the museum to understand chronology of the time period. After, the children took part in a workshop on Anglo Saxon runes. They learnt how and why it was formed and translated simple sentences. Additionally, they were challenged to create their own sentence using runes, becoming a real 'Anglo Saxon warrior'. We are excited for the next workshop on Monday when the museum staff visit the school.

#### **Class Reps Approving New Menus**





In our History lesson, this week, we considered the different sources of information we can use to learn more about the past. We ranked from most useful to least useful and explained our ranking system.





# Oyster Class




This week in Year 1, we have had a super busy week!

I was so proud of how hard they all worked on their writing; everyone is using their sounds to help them which is making a huge difference in their writing. Ask your children to tell you the story using our class story map.



In Maths, we have been doing 1 more and 1 less within 10 and the children have been displaying their answers on their fingers to show their understanding.

In RE, we have been learning the story of the Prodigal Son, we talked about the story and shared our thoughts on what it means to Christian people and why Jesus might have told the story. The children acted out the story and freeze framed their favourite parts.



In our Topic lesson, we have been talking about toys from the past. As a class, we came up with a list of questions we would like to ask our parents. The children could write the answers to these questions in their Homework books to talk about next week if you have time over the weekend.


What toys did you play with?



# **Heron Class**















