


### Autumn Term Newsletter Week 5 7th October 2022










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
### Seahorse Class



The children have also enjoyed developing their cutting skills whilst using the scissors, showing great concentration and perseverance.


In English, we have been using the internet to research facts about volcanoes and have written the introduction of our fact file. We have also planned the rest, ready to finish writing next week.

The key message was to speak out about bullying, whether it is to tell someone if you are being bullied, or to be an upstander (rather than a bystander) if you see someone else being bullied.


The children were told that teachers would be keeping an extra eye out this week for examples of acts of kindness and being a kind friend.


Children were asked to make a list of the people they could turn to if they felt they were being bullied. Some illustrated this by creating their helping hand of support.






