Reminder – Hair longer than shoulder length should be tied up

There are some children coming into school without their hair tied up. This is part of our school uniform policy. There is research to show that there are several good reasons to tie their hair up or at least off their face.

Eyes/Vision - Between the ages of one to seven is crucial for children's eye development. There is a school of thought, that if the hair is blocking one eye or falling partially over both eyes, that it can block out both daylight and sensory stimulation. A lack of either can inhibit the development of the eyes. It's important to find ways to clip or tie hair away from the face for this reason.

Chewing - Hair chewing habits can be prevented if the hair is tied away from the face.



Head-Lice - There are many ways in which to tackle those little critters. One of the best ways, is prevention. Having the hair tied back, particularly in a bun or plait is one of the most

effective ways of keeping the headlice at bay. With the hair tied back, it makes it more difficult for the lice to grab hold of the hair.

SEND Surgeries



We know it can be difficult for parent/carers of children and young people with SEND to find their way "through the system" and get clear information and answers to questions.

Based on this feedback, the Southend Council SEND Team will be holding monthly 'SEND Surgeries' in locations across Southend. The surgeries will provide families with an informal opportunity to drop in, ask questions and receive help on a range of topics.

Surgeries will take place on the third Tuesday of every month between 9:00am and 11:00am. There is no need to book, just come along. Details, dates and ven-




Well done, Seahorse Class for your first half term at school. Have a lovely break.

Seahorse Class





This week, Seahorse Class have been looking at our Senses and Diwali. We discovered we have 5 senses – touch, sight, taste, hearing and smell. We then matched each sense to the body part we would use. We discussed that although we use our hands to touch, it is our skin that can feel different sensations. Later in the week, we discussed which objects we liked and did not like to touch, taste, see, hear and smell. Ideas includ-

ed: rubbish, apples, flowers, teddy bear, music, tv and ice cream.

In Literacy, the children have been working on letter formation. They have also drawn and labelled objects they like to touch, see, taste, hear and smell.

In Maths, the children have been exploring 2D shapes. We have investigated the properties of different 2D shapes by becoming shape detectives, before using our imagination to draw a picture from 2D shapes. In the builder's tray, the children have used 2D and 3D shapes to build a shape city for their small world characters.

From Wednesday, the children have learned about the Festival of Lights – Diwali. We watched a CBeebies clip to discover how families celebrate Diwali. The children were enthralled by the story of Rama and Sita, which inspired us to make salt dough Diya lamps. The children have also created Rangoli pictures, Mendi patterns and paper lanterns.

In PE, the children have been practising their balancing skills, by controlling a ball on a tennis racket as they have moved around the playground in a variety


On Thursday, we had a virtual 'volcanoes and earthquakes' workshop (delivered by the Natural History Museum). The children showcased their knowledge and


Seagull Class

We have shared some excellent homework this week too. Chloe shared a map she had created of London showing the spread of the Great Fire of London each day.










Sports








Starfish Class

Head Pupil Interviews


