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Well done ,wonderful Year 4 for yet another fantastic week.







School dinners need to be **ordered and paid for in advance on the IRIS Parent Mail app**.

School dinner menus will be published weekly for the following week to be ordered and paid for on the ParentMail app. Universal and Free School Meal children will still need to order their choices on the ParentMail app **but will not be charged.**

To order, open the IRIS ParentMail app and go to accounts. In accounts there is the School Dinner Register, tap on this to open the School Dinner Register and tap one of the days. This will take you to the screen with the menus for the week where you can order your choices for the individual day or full.

Remember to book your child's Christmas lunch by Friday 18th November. This needs to be purchased through ParentMail not booked through the usual school dinner option. (If you are entitled to free school meals or universal free school meals you will automatically be put in for school lunch so do not need to book).



Seahorse Class











This week, the children have been exploring the seasons. We began the week by naming the 4 seasons and talking about attributes of the weather that indicate which season we are in.

As it has been windy, the children have made kites on the mark-making table. They drew the correct clothing for a person depending on the weather. They matched the different stages a tree goes through within each of the 4 seasons. We also learned that a tree that keeps it leaves all year long is called an evergreen.

In Literacy, the used a picture stimulus to arrange and write a sentence. We have been using the Ebooks to read together in class. We have also continued to work on our letter formation.

In Maths, the children looked at different ways to make 5. They used double-sided counters to represent number bonds, then orally stated the number sentence. Some children then attempted to write the number sentence on a whiteboard.

Inspired by the story 'The Dot' by Peter H Reynolds, each child was given a piece of paper and asked to use their imagination to draw a picture starting from the dot.

Throughout the week, the children have been threading, constructing with Duplo and trying to help animals escape the ice.

On Friday, the children investigated Remembrance Day. We discovered the origins of why we celebrate 11th November and why we wear a poppy. We learned there were red, black, and purple poppies and researched what these poppies represented. The children

then coloured a poppy in the red or purple for a whole school display. Mrs Newman, Mrs Penny and Mrs Rawlings






Seagull Class

In Spanish, we have been learning Spanish greetings with lots of support from our class expert.


This week, as a class, we have been looking at Remembrance Day and learning about the sacrifices made. Year 5 have created individual poppy pictures which will be on display in the class window.



Heron Class









If your child has additional needs, you will have received an individual provision plan highlighting key interventions your child is accessing. You will have received this during your parent consultation. You may have received your pupil's Individual Support Plans (ISP's) to our online system (EDUKEY), meaning that you were able to access your child's ISP and comment on this from home.

Thank you to those parents/carers who have commented on this online. Your comments are vital when discussing your child's provision and arrangements to support them in school. If you haven't had the opportunity to do so, please follow these simple steps below:

To set this up, you were given a unique access code attached to this guidance for you to log in with. If you haven't set up an account – below are the steps to follow to do so.

Go to www.edukeyapp.com/parents

- 1. You will have to enter your email address, the access code and your child's date of birth.
- 2. Tick the small box that says I don't have an account.
- 3. You will then be asked to enter further personal details.
- 4. This will then create an email sent to you to verify your email address. When you have completed this, you will then be able to log into your parent account and view your child's ISP.
- 5. At the bottom of the document is a comments box for you to add your parent comments in which will be included on your child's ISP.






Celebrating Achievement's
