### **Curlew Class**



Year 4 have worked fabulously well as always this week. Having relocated (our anagram word of the day on Monday!) to the ICT suite on Monday for 3 days, the children adapted immediately to their new surroundings and worked as productively as ever.

In science, we thought about how sound travels and how to amplify sounds. The children worked in pairs to make their own string telephones, investigating how sound travels along the string to be heard clearly at the receiving end. This will feed in perfectly to our work later in the term about the history of the EKCO company.

On Tuesday, a third of the class went to the O2 to represent our school at the Young Voices event. Whilst they were making us all proud, the remaining 2 thirds joined forces with Year 5 to participate in the latest 'My Future My Southend' workshop. They heard from local people working in the Green and Eco industry and considered how they could get into these areas of work in the future.

We have now got to the end of the first chapter of 'The Iron Man'. This week we learnt how he reconstructed himself and wrote instructions to explain this step by step.

In maths, we moved from multiplication to division and investigated ways to divide a 2 or 3-digit numbers by a single digit.

Well done, fantastic foursies!

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
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
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
Well thought out







# Seagull Class

This week, we have been looking at multiplication. We started by making groups of objects, checking that the groups were all equal and then using our number knowledge to find the totals. We moved on to introduce the multiplication symbol and make the link between multiplication and repeated addition calculations.











In our RE lesson this week, we shared the Jewish story of Creation, discussing Jewish beliefs about how God created the world and why a day of rest is so important within the Jewish religion.







Also, we have continued learning about Matthew Henson, ordering key points in his life, and we have been learning about explanation texts in English lessons. We have focused on birds and the different ways they move as a starting point for our explanations. We even had a go at flapping, gliding and steering in class!

### Seahorse Class



This week, Seahorse Class have explored dinosaurs through fiction and non-fiction texts. We began by listening to the story 'The Dinosaur Who Pooped the Past', where the main character and his dinosaur travel back in time and meet other dinosaurs. This led to a discussion on what the children knew about dinosaurs. They enthusiastically named a variety of dinosaurs with the Tyrannosaurus-Rex being the favourite.

As a class, we used a search engine and encyclopaedias to discover more facts about dinosaurs. The children were shocked to discover that humans and dinosaurs did not live in the same time-period. We also learnt that most dinosaurs were herbivores rather than carnivores and those that ate both meat and plants were omnivores.



On Wednesday, a mysterious egg appeared in the classroom. The children all had guesses as to what could be inside. They are extremely excited to see what hatches from it. In Literacy, the children wrote a sentence about what they thought was inside the egg. News of our egg travelled through the school, with Year 3 coming to see it on Wednesday afternoon! On Thursday, the egg had hatched a little, and on Friday we greeted our very own Diplodocus.



In Maths, we have begun to look at subtraction. We began by discussing all the different vocabulary that could mean subtract. In the classroom, the children rode on a bus (made from chairs) before a certain number of them got off. As a class, we counted how many children were left on the bus. They used the number sentence '? take away ? equals ?' to explain the activity. With an adult, each child used a bus ten frame to practice subtraction. On the play deck, skittles were played to demonstrate taking a number away from a larger number.



Throughout the week, the children have made dinosaur crafts, made paw prints in play dough, built with large blocks, sequenced number tiles and constructed puzzles. We have also enjoyed singing and dancing to the song 'The Dinosaur Dance.'

# **Oyster Class**











The week beginning 27<sup>th</sup> February is Aspirations week. If you would like to volunteer to come in and talk to the children, please let me know as soon as possible.

### Starfish Class




This week in Starfish class, our story focus has been The Great Race. A traditional story telling of how the twelve animals of the zodiac were chosen. This year is the year of the rabbit. The children had great fun joining in with the action song Little Bunnies.

We found out how Chinese lunar new year is celebrated, and the children loved watching a lion dance performance. We used our lion costume and instruments to perform our own dance and create our own music. The children further developed this experience using pots pans and spoons outside to make drum music.

We practised counting to twelve and the children were very eager to join in with an animal number hunt, trying to find pictures of the animals that were placed around

the nursery. We practised our mark making skills to tick or circle the animals that were found on our sheet. We have been listening carefully to try and identify the initial sounds of the animal's names and tried hard to form some of the letters in the animal's names.



We have had great fun role playing in our restaurant, taking on the role of customer and waiters and waitresses who have been busy writing food orders.


The children also went on a lucky red colour hunt and used a camera to record their findings.






Next week, our story focus will be Goldilocks and the Three Bears.

In English, we have been studying modal verbs and explanation texts. The children will be writing an explanation text on their knowledge of space so far.


In Maths, we have been learning short division and have recently started multiplying unit fractions by an integer.




# **Heron Class**
