Before and After School Sports Clubs will finish for the end of term on Friday 8th July .

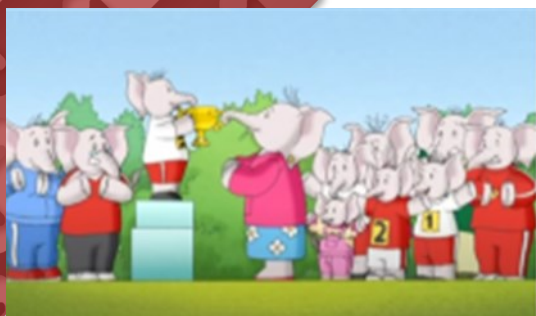
All other clubs will finish on Friday 15th July (this does not include Energy Kidz which is independent). School clubs do not run during the last or first week of term.

Seahorse Class

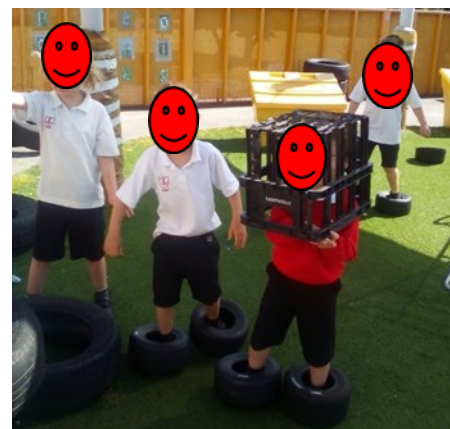

This week, the children in Nursery have been reading Kipper's Beach Ball and exploring life on the beach.

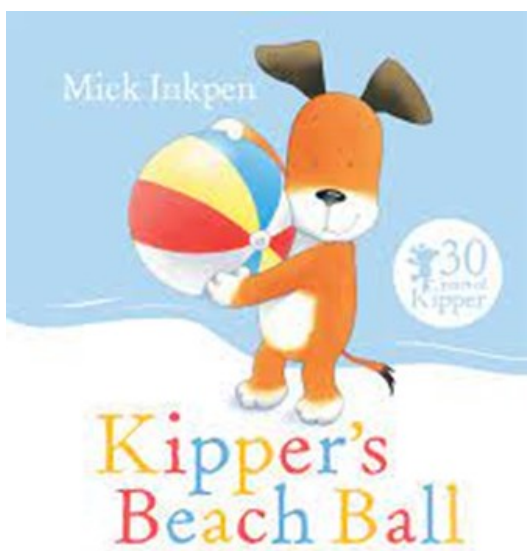

At lunchtime we were all thankful for the lovely weather and had a picnic and a well needed energy burn off on the hill behind the villa.

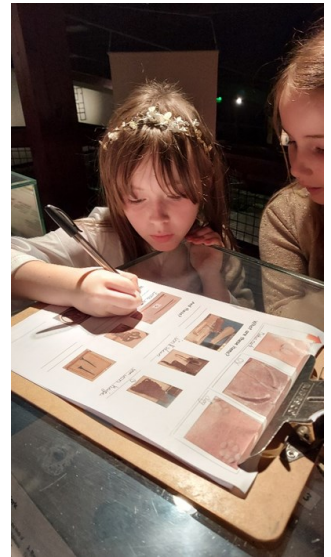
After lunch, each group finished their worksheets, did a little dressing up and then had the opportunity to buy souvenirs from the gift shop.

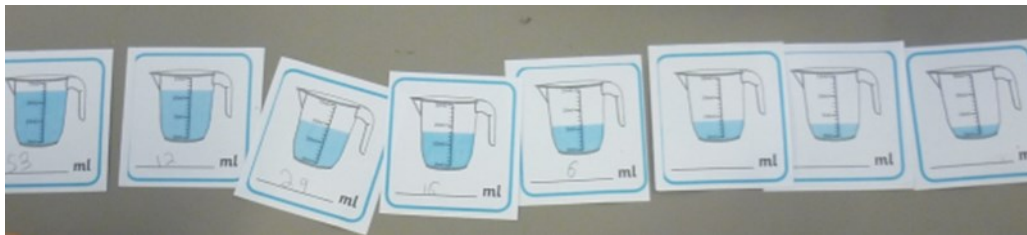
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Seagull Class
