

Years 2 Curriculum Letter – Summer Term 2023- TOPIC – Amazing Africa


Dear Parents/ Guardians,

Welcome back to our final term of the school year.

Throughout this term the children in Year 2 will be learning about the following:

Maths Units of work will include; fractions, time, statistics, position and direction. The 2X,5X & 10X tables will be continually recalled and practised. Children will also take part in a daily maths meeting where mental skills are practised and will be working on times table challenges as well as weekly problem-solving maths sessions.		English Units of work will include Narrative: Traditional stories, Recounts: letters and postcards, Persuasion texts, Poetry: monsters and dinosaur poems – short poems to perform. Regular phonics, spelling, grammar and handwriting as well as drama are also important aspects of our English work. We will also be completing regular comprehension activities and encouraging the children to write more independently as this is a Year 2 expectation.	
Science We will be working scientifically looking at living things and their habitats. We will also be learning more about plants and growth.	ICT This term we are being very creative in our computing lessons. Our units of work are creating pictures, making music and presenting ideas.	Geography Our Geography unit this term is Sensational Safari, which compares areas of the UK and Kenya.	History This term we will be looking at Nelson Mandela and exploring why he is a significant figure in African history.
PE Our PE day is Thursday, please ensure earrings are removed for PE lessons. This term we will also be swimming every Wednesday morning.	RE Our work will explore the unit of 'how should we care for others and the world, and why does it matter?'.	Music We will continue to develop our ukulele skills. We will also be looking at traditional African music.	Art/DT We will be looking at traditional African patterns and animal art. Including work by the artist Wilhelm Kuhnert. We will also design animal masks.

Hinguar Stars – READ, READ, READ!

We cannot express enough the importance of reading with your child at this young age. The positive effects are amazing. It increases their vocabulary, confidence and writing.

As an incentive, your child is awarded a weekly stamp in their home-school diaries every Friday; to receive this the adult at home must hear the child read 5 times per week, and log each time they have read in the reading diary. At the end of the term, if your child has achieved 10 stamps or more, they will receive a badge.
