DT

Design and label or even create a packed lunch in a lunchbox. Make sure that you select a healthy, balanced meal and try to include foods that provide all of the nutrients a human needs to develop healthy bones and strong muscles.

R.E.

Interview friends or relatives about their beliefs around the Easter story and traditions they do or don't follow. Do they eat specific food at Easter time? Do they go anywhere special on Easter Day? Do they have a special way for Easter eggs to be delivered or found? Write out an interview script before you speak to them, so you feel prepared with your questions. Make a note of different people's answers and write them in your homework book or create a word document on a computer.

DT/Art

Create an Ancient Civilisations themed board or card game using your knowledge from lessons in class or by researching some fun facts yourself at home. Use Egyptian, Phoenician or Sumerian designs to make it colourful and fun. You could try to teach someone in your family how to play.

History

Research what Ancient Egyptian or Ancient Sumerian homes looked like, then show what you have learnt by drawing pictures, writing a description, creating a model or a mixture of all three!

Science/Animals Including Humans

Draw a picture of an animal's skeleton (remember that humans are animals too). Use your knowledge from our lessons and also your own extra research to label it with any correct names for the different bones. The tasks here are homework activities for your child to complete over the next term. They should try to complete one task each fortnight, record it and hand it in on a Thursday. They can choose which order they complete their tasks in. Some will be tasks supporting learning, and some will be assessing prior knowledge of a subject.



Geography

Find out what the sign or symbol for Essex is.

What does each part represent? Label your picture to show what you have found out. Have a go designing your own county symbol to show what is important to you.

Science/Light

Use your knowledge of light, reflection and shadows to create a quiz between 5 and 10 questions. Make sure you also make an answer sheet! You can write your quiz on paper, or you could use a computer. Why not add pictures too?

Art

Apply your knowledge of Picasso to draw a painting in his style. You could do a self-portrait or a portrait of a friend or family member. Use paint, pen or pencil or maybe even try to create a collage in his style.

Art

Create your own city - the Indus cities were very neatly planned. Draw a design of your own city and label it to show the buildings you included and think carefully about how you would lay everything out. Which materials would you use to build with?

Complete your English and Maths homework (remember your log in for MyMaths is in the front of your reading record book if your homework is set online). Learn your times table challenge facts every week.

Read to someone at home and ask them to sign your reading record book.
