Plant bulbs and seeds at home and watch them grow.
Bring in your plants (or email in a photograph).
Write a diary explaining how you grew your plant.

Read and talk about stories or poems with plants or flowers in. eg. Jack and the Beanstalk, The Princess and the Pea, Jasper's Beanstalk, The Enormous Turnip, The Tiny Seed.

Make model flowers. Explore colour and pattern by mixing and layering tissue paper and cutting/ tearing spots and stripes for patterns. You could use recycling materials.

Learn how to spell the names of some common flowering plants like: rose, daisy, iris and tulip



Grow a herb garden at home. Use your herbs in some delicious recipes for your friends and family. Share your recipes with the class.

Find pictures online of famous flower paintings. Talk about your likes and dislikes with an adult. You might want to have a go at creating your own picture in the artist's style.



Observe someone cooking, write a list of the herbs used in the recipe.

You might even want to help safely with some parts.



Paint or draw flowers growing in the local environment.

Visit a garden centre, florist or plant sale. Walk around with your adult and amaze them with your plant knowledge.
