

On Tuesday, we shared a story with Mrs Gentry who works as a train driver. She shared information about how she trained for her job and what her daily routine involves. The children enjoyed hearing about what is involved and were particularly impressed that the visitor was someone they already knew and had seen in school and out on the playground with her own children.



Also, on Tuesday we got active with some representatives from Southend United Football Club. We joined in with some movement games similar to those used with the real footballers to develop their control, coordination, collaboration and teamwork skills.

Well done, Seahorse class for coping with all the exciting changes that we had this week.






## Heron Class


### Reading Champions

### Catch Me!' Awards






KS1 Seahorse Class having attendance of 95.83% and in
