MERSEA ISLAND

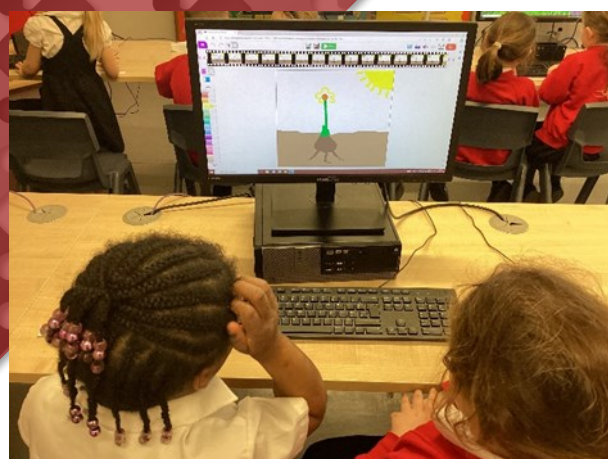

Seahorse Class

This week, we have explored the festival of Easter. We began the week by talking about what we know about this celebration. Many children spoke about going on egg hunts, eating chocolate, new animals being born and flowers growing. We researched the religious story of Easter and realised that it was about the death and rebirth of Jesus.

We looked at how people from around the world celebrate Easter and found that Australia does not have an Easter bunny but an Easter Bilby. In Germany, decorated eggs hung from a tree or shrub are called an Ostereierbaum and in Scotland they roll an egg down a hill.

Throughout the week, the children have been colouring Easter eggs, rabbits and writing on envelopes at the mark-making table. Outside, the children have been fascinated by making ramps – these have included water ramps for boats to float in and car ramps so that the cars can perform stunts.

On Wednesday, we went to Barleylands. On the journey, the children enjoyed looking out of the window and spotting familiar sights such as Asda, MacDonalds, Lidl, a carwash and a train.

At Barleylands, we went on a BUMPY tractor ride before we explored the farm and saw lots of animals. We fed the goats and sheep and stroked some bunnies. We also saw a wallaby, a turkey, some pigs and cows. After a picnic lunch, we heard The Gingerbread Man story, before making our own gingerbread men (who did not jump up and run away!).

Starfish Class

This week in Starfish class, our story focus has been We're Going on a Bear Hunt.

We have been recalling the story and sequencing the different landscapes the characters travelled through. To record this, the children helped to create a story map.

We went outside to use our senses on a nature walk and had great fun acting out the story in the outdoor classroom. We thought about how the characters moved through the different landscapes in the story to create our own movements.

Seagull Class



This week, the children were extremely excited about inviting their parents into the classroom for some collaborative learning. As a part of our final week of the Polar Explorers topic, the children, and parents, were challenged to design and make model igloos. Prior to the lesson, the children had spent some time learning about how and why igloos are constructed. They completed their design first then were able to start construction with some adult help.



It was interesting to see the modifications and 'in the moment' problem solving taking place as the construction process developed.

Having completed the model igloos, the children evaluated what they felt had been successful and how they would improve their model. They then asked parents to complete the same evaluations.



We were so impressed with the fantastic models created, it was lovely to see how engaged and creative the children were. We were so grateful that the open morning was so well supported by parents – thank you!

After the lesson the children talked about what they had enjoyed most. Some of their responses were:



'I loved it because my dad got to see what we have been learning. I knew more about igloos than he did so I could tell him some things.'

'It was good to work collaboratively.'

'I liked it because we could help each other to make it better and think of extra things to add on to the model.'



'I thought it was good that everyone had different ideas, but they all made a good model.'

'I liked it when we could look at what our friends had made and we could show them what we had done too. '

This week, they have been working on their grammar and writing about the natural world. We were all interested to discover that there are pink dolphins living in the murky waters of the Amazon River.

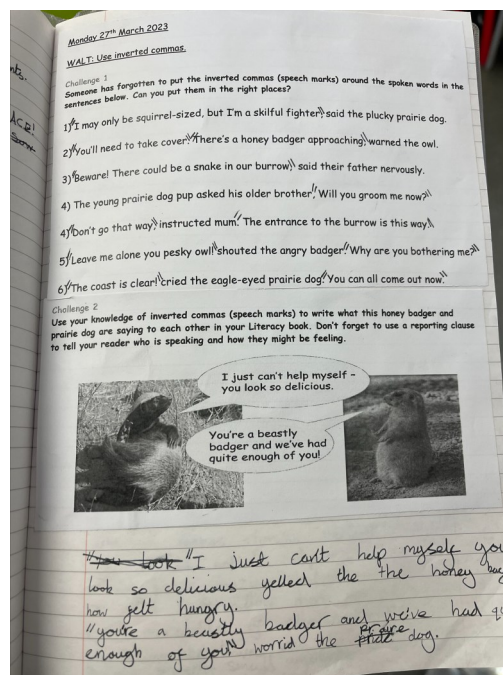
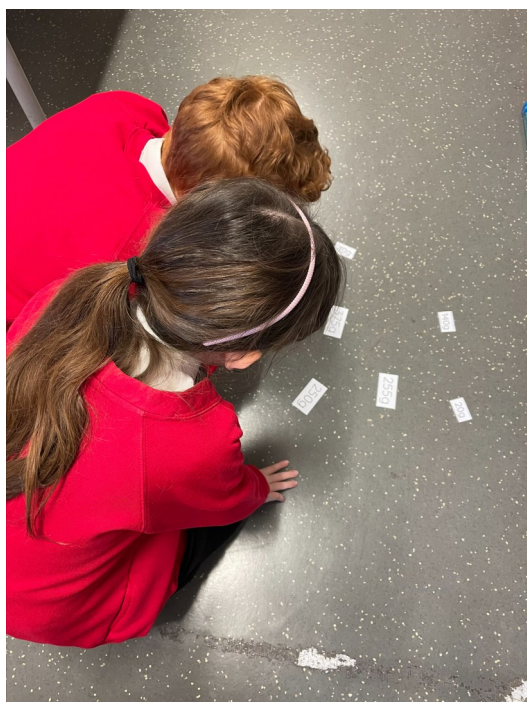
For Maths, we have been looking at weight and mass. The class enjoyed an Active Maths lesson, where they had to look around the room for calculations and find the answers.

If your child has additional needs, you will have received an individual provision plan highlighting key interventions your child is accessing. You will have received this during your parent consultation. You may have received your pupil's Individual Support Plans (ISP's) on our online system (EDUKEY), meaning that you were able to access your child's ISP and comment on this from home.

Thank you to those parents/carers who have commented on this online. Your comments are vital when discussing your child's provision and arrangements to support them in school. If you haven't had the opportunity to do so, please follow these simple steps below:

To set this up or access this, you were given a unique access code attached to this guidance for you to log in with. If you haven't set up an account – below are the steps to follow to do this.

1. Go to www.edukeyapp.com/parents
2. You will have to enter your email address, the access code and your child's date of birth.
3. Tick the small box that says I don't have an account.
4. You will then be asked to enter further personal details.
5. This will then create an email sent to you to verify your email address. When you have completed this, you will then be able to log into your parent account and view your child's ISP.
6. At the bottom of the document is a comments box for you to add your parent comments in which will be included on your child's ISP.

Important Information about MCAS

From **17th April 2023**, the only method for online payments, ordering school dinners or booking wrap around care for Hinguar Primary School will be via **MCAS**. **IRIS Parent-Mail will no longer be used from this date.** The ordering of school dinners and booking before and after school wrap-around care clubs for the summer term (w/b 17th April 2023) via MCAS will be available from **20th March 2023**.

The Dinners option and the Clubs & Trips option will be accessible via the menu in the MCAS app and via a web browser.

If you do not have access to MCAS, please contact the school office who will be able to send you an *invitation code* and *link* to activate your personal account. **In July, end of year school reports will be available to access via MCAS. There will be no paper copies issued. Please make sure that you have activated your account before then to receive your child's report.**

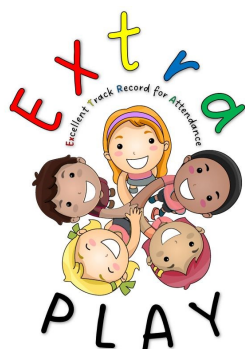
