Art/Science

Rumble in the Jungle

Art

Combine the features of 2 animals from the rainforest to create your own new animal. Draw them in detail and label your drawing. Make a fictional fact file for it. What name would you give it? Which features did you choose and why?

History

Research and create an information poster about the Mayan religious beliefs and some of the Gods that they worshipped. Remember to use eyecatching, bright colours to enhance your design.

Science

Demonstrate your understanding of how water is transported by the stem by creating a 3D picture. Use a straw for the stem, and collage materials for the rest of the plant.

DT/Science

Create a game of pairs by drawing the parts a flower on cards and writing an explanation of each part's job on different cards.

EVERY WEEK

Complete your English and Maths homework (logins for MyMaths are in your reading records). Learn your times table challenge facts every week.

Geography

Create a "Save our Rainforests" poster to show what is happening to the rainforest and how the habitats of many animals are being destroyed.

The tasks here are homework activities for your child to complete over the next term. They may complete one task each fortnight, record it and hand it in on a Thursday. Tasks can be completed in any order; some will be tasks supporting learning, and

some will be assessing prior knowledge of a subject.

Art

Look at some of the artwork inspired by Rainforests or based on ancient Mayan design. Create your own design using materials of your choice. (collage, paint, pencil, watercolour, chalks, coloured pencils)

History

Find out about the Mayan ball game of Poka-tok then write a set of instructions explaining how to play it: https://mayas.mrdonn.org/ballgames.html

D.

Design and make a model of a rainforest. What could you use from our natural/manmade environment? How would you present the model? Could you use real plants or would you make them from fabric or paper. Think about the plant layers e.g. shrub layer, under canopy.

Music

Choose and perform a rainforest dance or create a piece of music / dance. What music/sounds would for with the rainforest theme? What movements would you choose? Choose to video it or perform it in school! Happy dancing and playing.

Geography

Use the internet to find out what the weather is like in the Amazon Rainforest for each day in one week. Include rainfall and temperature. Record your findings in a table/chart. Remember to include a key for people to understand it.

Science

Try growing a plant from a seed at home. Remember not to move it outside until the weather is warm enough. Try a sunflower or a bean. Make sure you ask a grown up first.

EVERY WEEK

Read to someone at home and ask them to sign your reading record book. This needs to be done at least 5 times a week. Learn your spellings for the test on Monday.
