Sensory Support Station

Guests or Company in the Home Cause Distress

Sensory Explanation:

Social interaction in a group setting is a multi- sensory experience and requires a nervous system which is able to adapt minute to minute. Often auditory, visual and tactile input is at a very high level and can be difficult for the child to process. The other higher level components include eye contact and communication skills which are also very demanding on the nervous system. Children with sensory differences tend to prefer structure, routine and predictability...all of which can be disrupted when company is in the home.

Ideas to Help!

- Provide earplugs and headphones
- Have a sensory space (their own space) available for the child.
- Respect the child's possible need to leave the social setting.
- Do not place demands on verbally engaging or making eye contact, as these two skills are extremely difficult for a child who is dysregulated.


• Prior to the guests arriving, help prep your child's nervous system by at least 15-20 minutes of calming sounds and movements.

• Allow the child to play outside during the gathering, if possible.

Starfish Class



This week in Starfish class, our story focus has been 'Whatever Next?'

In the story, Baby Bear used an empty cardboard box as a rocket to travel to the moon. This led to lots of discussion about what each of the children would use a cardboard box for.

During our cooking activity this week, we made fruity rockets. The children

developed their fine motor skills to thread the different fruits onto the skewer and we talked about healthy eating choices.

We have made some great space rockets and cut out pictures of ourselves so we can pretend to fly our rockets into outer space! We then created a background of stars in the night sky by splatter painting with yellow and white paint.





The children have expanded their vocabulary, learning about the different names and features of the planets in our solar system.

We watched a video of a rocket launch. The children enjoyed counting down from ten to zero. We then acted out being rockets, counting down, then blasting off into space.

Our story focus next week will be 'The Naughty Bus?'

Avocet Class



In Art, we have continued to create our African masks by adding details and extra layers. In PE, we have continued our Athletics training and have enjoyed our first swimming lesson of 2023.


In PSHE, we have begun our new unit linked to relationships and growing up. We discussed the different types of people and things we may have relationships with and how they may differ now and in the future.






Seahorse Class



This week, our theme has been Royalty and we have focused on King Charles III's coronation. We began by listening to King Charles III's Colourful Coronation by Campbell Books. From this story we discovered that the King would be coronated in the King Edward's crown, which had 444 jewels on it. On the mark-making table the children made their own crowns using sequins and the royal colour of purple, before designing Union Jack flags. Later we listened to the King's Pants by Nicholas Allan. The children were then tasked with designing underwear for our King.



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In Maths, we have looked at addition past 10, using 10 as

the base number. We have used the stem sentence "First we have 10, then we add 4, now we have 14 altogether" to show the addition process. The children placed 10 bears in a bed, before choosing a number card to add bears to a second bed. The children then counted on from 10 to solve the calculation.

Throughout the week, the children have enjoyed constructing carriages and cars from the outdoor resources, made patterns and pictures using the pegs and boards, tried a variety of climbing challenges on the 'A' frame and had tea parties in the kitchen role play area.

Well done, Seahorse Class for your first swimming lesson.

After speaking to the children, they told me that the teacher is called Chris, the swimming pool is warm, and they loved it! Thank you to the parents volunteers who helped the children get changed.
















This week in KS1, Alice the Bunny was won by Oyster Class with 93.55% and KS2 the attendance cup was awarded to Avocet Class with 96.67%.
