



Starfish Class









This week in Starfish class, our story focus has been 'The Train Ride.'

The children enjoyed predicting and finding out what the little girl saw out of the train window on her journey. They then worked together to collect toys from around the nursery to set up a small world scenario based on the story.

We have enjoyed telling each other about our own experiences of travelling by train and drew our own pictures to show what we thought we might see out of the window on a train journey.

Following on from our learning around shapes, the children have been busy creating their own train pictures using various shapes.

We looked closely at modern and old-fashioned trains and talked about their similarities, differences and how they were powered.

The children listened carefully to the rhythm of the story which we discovered sounded like a train travelling along the train tracks.

In the garden, the children have been busy going on their own train rides, using the tunnel as a train and taking it in turns to be the driver. They went on many adventures together, including a trip to adventure Island, CeBeebies land and the beach!

Our story focus next week will be 'Ten Little Pirates'

Seahorse Class



This week, our theme has been occupations. We have explored doctors, nurses, police officers, vets, builders and dentists. We have listened to fiction and non-fiction books about these occupations to discover what tasks, uniforms and equipment is needed if you work in these roles. The children greatly enjoyed the hospital role-play station we borrowed from Starfish Class. Throughout the week it has been turned into a vets, dentist and doctor's surgery. They have used the toy medical equipment, bandaged their heads and legs and put their arms into slings.

In Literacy, the children discussed what job they would like to do when they grow up. They then wrote a sentence about their occupation, concentrating on their letter formation, before drawing themselves in their job role. On the markmaking table, the children have been making police badges and hats, drawn wanted posters and taken messages on note pads.

In Art, the children have been exploring colour and what happens if certain colours are mixed. After listen to the story Mouse Paint, the children painted their hands different colours before rubbing their hands together to create a new colour. They then created handprints to show the colours.

In Maths, we have looked at subtraction from 10 or 20. We began by singing

'ten in the bed' and '10 green bottles' to understand in subtraction you count backwards, and the total gets lower. The children then rolled a dice and moved a toy backwards along a 10 or 20 number track. We used the stem sentence 'first we have ... then we take away ..., now we have ... to recognise the subtraction calculation that had taken place.

Throughout the week, the children have created pictures from tap-ashape, constructed with the wooden planks and bricks, moulded with playdough and played football on the play deck.


In Maths, we have been learning about position and direction. We found it tricky knowing our left and right and will continue to practice this in the coming weeks.








Seagull Class



Avocet Class










Other Achievements

Sensory Support

th-brushing causes Distress

th-brushing involves oral sensory and tactile input, which can be overwhelming to the nervous system if tactor or oral sensory defensiveness is present. The adverse response can be from the feeling of the toothbrush or the taste and smell of the toothpaste.

- Use a baby toothbrush with soft bristles and no toothpaste at first, even if it's an older child. Then work your way up to using toothpaste.
- Try various toothpaste flavours.
- Get the child involved from the first step and let him/her brush their own teeth (you can finish).
- Provide a blowing activity right before tooth-brushing.
- Have the child to chew gum or eat a chewy or crunchy snack right before tooth brushing to prep their mouth.
- · Try a vibrating toothbrush or spin brush.
- · Sing songs to your child and let the child dance a little during the task.

and in KS2 Heron Class on 95.91%.




100% Attendance and Punctuality Prize
