# Starfish Class



This week in Starfish class, our story focus has been 'The Large Family – Sports Day.'

The children have enjoyed developing their gross motor skills in the nursery garden. The children were very enthusiastic

and showed great pride when demonstrating their skills. We noticed the effect that exercise has on our bodies, exploring how we felt hotter, and our hearts were beating faster.

We have been practising with sports equipment on the field in readiness for sports day, next week. The children showed great encouragement to their friends and team mates, clapping and cheering them on.

We have discussed our favourite sports and the different sports equipment we might use. We linked our own feelings to the story to talk about taking part and 'having a go'.

We have been busy designing our own sports medals and rosettes to wear and have explored ordinal numbers.

Our story focus next week will be 'Kipper's Beach Ball.'



### Seahorse Class



This week, our story focus has been Mr Men Sports Day. We began the week by discussing what a Sports Day is. This led onto us talking about Hinguar's Sports Day, where we discussed who may be coming, that we would be competing in our house teams for points and that we would be having a picnic

afterwards. As a class, we are now counting down the

number of sleeps to Sports Day.

Within the story we explored the vocabulary spectator, baton and sprint. The children have been reading different Little Miss and Mr Men books from a large


collection which are in our book corner. In Literacy, the children have drawn a family portrait, before writing a corresponding sentence.

In Art, they have designed their own Mr Men or Little Miss characters. Last week, the children finished their Mary Blair inspired castle prints. Mary Blair was an artist who

drew many Disney castles in animations such as Cinderella, Peter Pan and Alice in Wonderland.

Once again, we had long discussions about the thunder and lightning. This led onto further discussions about storms, rainbows, clouds and the darkness.

Later in the week, we spoke about teamwork and good sportsmanship. We decided we needed to cheer on everyone at Sports Day to demonstrate encouragement, respect and a positive attitude to others' efforts.



Day. Some children used the resources to make watches, while others made kites. The children went on a word hunt looking for words related to sports.

In Maths, we have looked at doubles. We began by watching a short Number-block animation called 'Double Trouble' which explained the doubling process. We then played pairs so the children could find matching doubles; this activity also extended the children's memory. Throughout the game we used the stem sentence 'double 3 = 6'. Other doubling activities included children drawing butterflies using the same Numicon plate to represent the wings, rolling a dice and building a tower to represent double the amount.



Throughout the week, the children have created with the magnetic shapes, moulded with chocolate scented playdough, made marble runs and rolled tyres in the outdoor area.










# Oyster Class












# **Avocet Class**





#### **School lunch costs**

I am sure you will be well aware of surging food costs and the difficult inflation situation we are all living with at the moment. This has meant uncertainty and massive price variability for our catering team as we continue to try to deliver the best possible school meals for the children at our schools. Schools up and down the country are having to significantly increase meal costs and this is impacting on families already struggling with the cost of living crisis.

With this in mind we are very pleased to advise you that we will not be increasing the cost of school lunches and this will remain for the school year 23/24. This is part of our support to you as families. We have been able to get to this point by working together as a Trust to make the most of our collective buying power and in house provision of catering. We hope this is a rare bit of good news in a world where prices seem to be rising almost daily.

#### Dinners are now available to be booked in advance on MCAS for the rest of the term.

The Dinners option and the Clubs & Trips option is accessible via the menu in the MCAS app and via a web browser.

If you do not have access to MCAS, please contact the school office who will be able to send you an *invitation code* and *link* to activate your personal account.

In July, end of year school reports will be available to access via MCAS. There will be no paper copies issued. Please make sure that you have activated your account before then to receive your child's report.

KS1 Seahorse Class having attendance of 93.81% and in KS2 Avocet Class on 96.43%.




### **100% Attendance and Punctuality Prize**
