This week in Starfish class, our story focus has been 'Kipper's Beach Ball.'

The children have enjoyed looking closely at natural seaside items such as seaweed, shells and stones. This led to us playing Kim's game, a memory game, where we tried to work out which sea creatures were missing from the tray.

They were very enthusiastic when exploring the sand in the garden. They worked together to collect and mix water into the sand and enjoyed experiencing how the textures changed.

We have been discussing how to keep safe near the water and have shared our own seaside experiences with each other.

The children have been busy painting and decorating their own starfish and creating sandcastle pictures.

Our story focus next week will be 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar.'






Seahorse Class



This week, our theme has been dinosaur picnics, which was chosen by the children. We discussed what we thought a picnic was and what types of food we would eat. Throughout the week we have listened to stories such as The Dinosaur Who Discovered Hamburger, Dragons Love Tacos, We're Going on a pPicnic and The Perfect Picnic.





In Maths, we have looked at halving. We began by discussing vocabulary such as sharing, dividing, whole, 2 halves and equal size, which the children may encounter when exploring halving problems. As a class, we initially looked at dividing objects into 2 halves, before looking at sharing objects between 2 people. We discovered that only even numbers can be halved to produce an equal quantity. As a class we divided different quantities of children into 2 equal groups. For our focused activity, the children selected different picnic foods and cut them in half before sticking them into their books, whilst discussing their knowledge about halving.

Throughout the week, the children have made dinosaur prints in play dough, created a picnic in the role-play area, constructed a city from the wooden blocks and explored the new toys in our water tray.

Oyster Class



This week, we had a visit from 'Southend Diving'. The children worked with the diving coaches to try a series of challenges, testing their core strength, flexibility, agility and listening skills. The coaches were impressed with the children's enthusiasm and positive attitude and some children were invited to continue working with Southend Diving to develop their skills further. Maybe, one day they will become regional, national or even Olympic divers!





In science this week, we planned an experiment linked to plants. We discussed the conditions needed for plants to grow and be healthy. Then we set up four sets of cress seeds. We discussed fair testing and tried to ensure that we used the same amount of seeds for each and kept the conditions as similar as we could, only changing one aspect for each set of seeds. We had one set of seeds without water, one without light, one with limited air and one control set with water, light and air.

Later in the week, we looked at our cress seeds and observed changes, discussing how the results compared with our predictions.

The children showed excellent scientific enquiry skills and were able to discuss the changes observed and consider why each result occurred.




Heron Class

Well done ,everyone for being simply the best!



School lunch costs

I am sure you will be well aware of surging food costs and the difficult inflation situation we are all living with at the moment. This has meant uncertainty and massive price variability for our catering team as we continue to try to deliver the best possible school meals for the children at our schools. Schools up and down the country are having to significantly increase meal costs and this is impacting on families already struggling with the cost of living crisis.

With this in mind we are very pleased to advise you that we will not be increasing the cost of school lunches and this will remain for the school year 23/24. This is part of our support to you as families. We have been able to get to this point by working together as a Trust to make the most of our collective buying power and in house provision of catering. We hope this is a rare bit of good news in a world where prices seem to be rising almost daily.

Dinners are now available to be booked in advance on MCAS for the rest of the term.

The Dinners option and the Clubs & Trips option is accessible via the menu in the MCAS app and via a web browser.

If you do not have access to MCAS, please contact the school office who will be able to send you an *invitation code* and *link* to activate your personal account.

In July, end of year school reports will be available to access via MCAS. There will be no paper copies issued. Please make sure that you have activated your account before then to receive your child's report.

KS1 Seahorse Class having attendance of 92.63% and in KS2 Avocet Class on 95.61%.




100% Attendance and Punctuality Prize
