In Nursery this week, the children have been learning about Diwali and Remembrance Day.

For Diwali, the children have been investigating patterns and colours and have made their own Mehndi patterns. The children also enjoyed joining in with some Indian dancing.

Seahorse Class







This week, Seahorse Class have been very busy learning about nocturnal animals, Diwali and Remembrance Day. We began the week by discussing what the word nocturnal meant, before exploring animals who were awake at night. This led to the story Owl Babies; as we looked at this book, we considered how we knew it was nighttime through the images.

In Literacy, the children used their phonic skills to blend and write the caption 'bat on a hat'. This term in phonics, as well as identifying and blending sounds, we have begun the writing section. As a class, the children blend and write CVC words on whiteboards.


In Maths, we have explored the concept of time through sequencing events. The children discussed what activities happened at certain times of the day. We have listened to the story Day Monkey, Night Monkey and considered what objects and events may be strange to us if we stayed awake at nighttime.

Throughout the week, the children have made Rangoli patterns using Numicon, flown paper in the wind, made seesaws and catapults from the wooden blocks, and role-played as teachers.

Later in the week, the children explored the origins of the festivals of Diwali and Remembrance. They watched CBeebies clips to expand their understanding. In continuous provision, the children had a Diwali feast in the home corner, made Mehndi patterns, created poppies and medals.

The Bronze Times Table Challenge is on p16 of your child's reading record. We will be testing these over the next couple of weeks.

We are seeing an influx of toys from home being bought into school. Please could you refrain from allowing your child to bring toys into school, as they are unsettling other children, and we cannot guarantee they will not become lost. Thank you.

A big well done to our presentation queen, Zara, this week! I wonder who will wear the crown next?








Seagull Class







We continued our learning in the ICT suite and completed an Iron Age quiz on the computers.


Curlew Class




Also this week, we have upped our focus on times tables. 5 children have achieved specific times table




Sanderling Class



KS1 Oyster Class, having attendance of 98.89% overall and in KS2 Avocet Class with 98.21%.




100% Attendance and Punctuality Prize

The classes will be rewarded with an extra turn on the play equipment.





Tickets will be available on the day to visit Santa; card and cash will be accepted.



Let's see if we can beat our total of over £600 from last year's stalls!


