Information regarding Clubs at the end of term


Sporting Clubs finish on Friday 8th December (with the exception of KS1 football & KS2 Gymnastics on Friday which parents have been informed about).

This week in Starfish class, our story focus has been 'Bear Snores On'.

We have expanded our vocabulary, learning the word hibernate, and have investigated which animals hibernate over the winter months. In our tuff tray we have explored ice and looked closely at the changes that occurred as the ice melted. We have been developing our fine motor skills as we investigated using spoons and toffee hammers to break the ice blocks.

We have used our gross physical skills to create our own animal dens in the garden and role-played being animals hibernating inside to keep warm.

We discussed what we do to keep ourselves warm in winter and the children created some fantastic winter clothes pictures. The children

thought it was great fun as we drew around one of our friends to create a life-sized picture.

Well done, Turtle and Starfish class on another busy week of fun and learning.

Seahorse Class



This week in Seahorse Class, we have explored The Stickman. We began the week by listening to the story. This led to a discussion about what the game 'pooh sticks' could be. We also discussed how Stickman and Lady Love might feel throughout the book. As a class we used our memory recall and sequenced the story.

In Literacy, the children came up with ideas about what else the Stickman could become. Ideas included: a rocket, crown, aeroplane, insect and a jelly. The children then wrote their ideas using the sentence starter, Stickman will be a, before drawing a picture. The children have also been on a 'sh' and 'nk' word hunt.



In Maths, we have looked at the numbers 4 and 5. We have explored different ways to make both of these numbers. The children have arranged blocks, drawn squares and made towers to represent the composition of each number.

We have continued to practice our Nativity songs and have begun to sing and perform our actions in the hall in preparation for our performance.

Throughout the week, the children have made Stickman puppets, created missing posters of the Stickman, made sandcastles and used sticks as masts, role-played as office workers and enjoyed using the new slide section of the A frame.












Oyster Class

The children had lots of fun in the computer suite this week and have enjoyed practising our Christmas songs.




Avocet Class

KS1 Oyster Class, having attendance of 96.48% overall and in KS2 Avocet Class with 95.83%.




100% Attendance and Punctuality Prize






Reminders for Parents
