





Year 5 Homework Grid Term

The tasks below are homework activities for your child to complete over the next term. Please only complete one task each fortnight, record it and hand it in on any Friday listed below. The children do not need to complete all the tasks. They can choose which order they complete their tasks in, some will be tasks supporting learning, and some will be assessing prior knowledge of a subject.



<p>Maths</p> <p>Draw a diagram of a Viking Longhouse. Label the measurements clearly for the width and length of the building. Work out the building's area and perimeter.</p>	<p>ICT</p> <p>Research the Vikings and create a poster that contains at least 6 key facts about the Anglo-Saxon to Viking period in Britain. Think about any pictures that could be included.</p>	<p>English</p> <p>Create a word search or crossword with a Viking or Anglo-Saxon theme. Challenge yourself by including some Norse vocabulary from our history lessons or from your own research.</p>	
<p>Geography</p> <p>Think about how electricity is generated and distributed to where people need it. Can you write an explanation of this process? You could include subheadings and diagrams to make your piece easy to understand.</p>	<p>ANGLO-SAXONS</p> <p>VERSUS</p> <p>THE VIKINGS</p>		<p>Art</p> <p>Use your skills to sketch, paint or draw the Viking Tree of Life - known as Yggdrasill. You could use a combination of different mediums or create a collage.</p>
<p>Science</p> <p>Carrier bag test - bags are made from different materials with certain properties. Use different carrier bags and test which is the strongest. How many items can they hold before they break? You will need help from your parents.</p>	<p>Art</p> <p>Research Anglo-Saxon clothing & design an outfit for an Anglo-Saxon chieftain or his wife. Or challenge yourself to create a new pagan god and design their outfit (remember to label your drawings with materials used and include weapons).</p>	<p>English</p> <p>Write a poem about the Viking raid on Lindisfarne. Apply your descriptive skills and challenge yourself to see if you can keep to a strict rhyme and rhythm structure.</p>	
<p>Design & Technology</p> <p>Create a mini model of an Anglo-Saxon village.</p> <div></div> <p>You could use old boxes, plasticine or even Lego. Be creative with your medium!</p>	<p>EVERY WEEK</p> <p>Read to someone at home and ask them to sign your reading record book. This needs to be done at least 5 times a week.</p> <p>Complete your My Maths and Spag.com homework (remember your log in is in the front of your reading record book). Keep learning your times table facts.</p>	<p>Science</p> <p>What is a reversible or irreversible change? Can you carry out an experiment for each? Are dissolving, mixing and changes of state reversible or irreversible? Can you find out about any irreversible changes?</p> <div></div>
