
Turtle and Starfish Class



Our focus this week was The Three Little Pigs. We loved listening to the story and then talking about which house was the strongest and why. Then we talked about what the characters in the story said and joined in with the repeating parts of the story....all trying to "huff and puff and blow the house down."



The children 'built' lots of houses for the pigs in the construction area.



The children all had a go at drawing the houses of straw, sticks and bricks or mark marking. Turtle class told us that the wolf blew the houses down.....'huff and puff."

We love Peppa Pig in nursery too and the children take her on adventures with her animal friends. Peppa loves jumping in muddy puddles and plays in the mud like real pigs. So we had some 'mud' (cornflower gloop) in nursery, to explore the feel of it and to pour over the little pigs. We had a mudtastic time!

Seahorse Class



This week in Seahorse Class, we have explored the story Jack and the Jellybean Stalk. We have looked at the different plot points within the story. Grandma Fantastic has helped us to expand our vocabulary when describing certain events. We have also explored the meaning of the following words: dismay, rock bottom, reminiscing, inquisitive, scaled, colossal. In Literacy, the children have used their own ideas to write a sentence about the colour and taste of a jellybean. We have watched a dinosaur version of Jack and the Beanstalk, and the story told through song.



In a Personal, Social and Emotional lesson, we have looked at how we can keep ourselves and our bodies private and safe. We have watched the NSPCC animation Pantosaurus, which gave us 5 simple rules: privates are private, your body belongs to you, no means no, talk about secrets that upset you and speak up as someone can help you. We also discussed which body parts are known as our privates, who may need to look there for health reasons – Doctors, Mums and Dads and practised how to say 'No'. The children have designed some pants on the mark making table.

In Maths, we have been looking at the composition of numbers 6, 7, 8. The children have used jellybeans, a part-part –whole tray and number cards to explore how to add numbers together to make 6, 7 and 8. We have used the oral

number sentence '? add ? equals ?' with some children expressing this on white



boards.

Throughout the week the children have played in the sweet shop home corner, made lollipops, written price labels, constructed with Mobilo, gone on a bean hunt, and used their fine motor skills with the loom bands and tap-a-shapes.

Year 1 have been working extremely hard this week on their reading. They have really enjoyed exploring many alien words and tricky words. Please do keep reading and sharing books with your children at home!









Seagull Class




This week, we have continued to explore multiplication and we have also introduced the division symbol. The children have been working hard to show grouping and sharing. They have made arrays and represented their calculations using practical apparatus.





In our art lessons with Miss Brailsford, we have been looking at the work of Steven Brown. We created our own 'McCoos' using a mixed media collage technique.





In our RE lesson this week, we went on a virtual tour of a mosque, then we shared a story of a little girl called Ayisha, who was visiting a new mosque for the first time. The children then explored her feelings at different points in the story by playing a runaround game, running to the correct part of the room to show their answer. The children were very good at explaining why they had chosen each answer by referring back to the original story.

This week in Year 3, we have been finishing our stories about the magic paintbrush. As always, I was impressed by the children's ambitious vocabulary choices, particularly their use of precise verbs and alliteration.

In our History lessons, we have been learning about early forms of communication. We worked together using the Phoenician Alphabet. In groups we had to work out which symbols went with each picture and then after being given some sentences using the same symbols, what each sentence said. Everyone found it really tricky as there were no vowels.

Finally this week, we participated in a building and structures zoom lesson from My Future My Southend which the children found really engaging. They had some fabulous questions and had some really interesting group discussions about their aspirations for the future.










Curlew Class



Well done, Fantastic Foursies for being fabulous as always, this week.




In Maths this week, we started our new topic of 'length and perimeter'. After spending 2 days looking at the relationship between metres and kilometres, we then moved on to finding the perimeter of rectilinear shapes. Please support your child in their understanding of this and ensure they complete their homework to reinforce their learning.

In PSHE this half term, we are exploring different emotions and how to manage negative emotions. This week, we have focussed on friendships. We considered how we need to behave to be a good friend, and also the appropriate ways to respond if someone is not acting in a friendly way towards you.











Sanderling Class




Avocet Class


