Turtle and Starfish Class




This week, both classes have enjoyed starting daily Dough Disco. This is using playdough to exercise fingers and hands to music. Please look this up on-line for examples and you will see how much fun they are having while developing their finger strength for writing. In the outside area the children have been matching pinecones to numbers and using team work to build houses for animals.



Turtles class have been using blue water for filling and emptying, improving motor control.

This week in Turtles class, we have been reading Brown bear and learning about animals and colours. We have been expanding our vocabulary by learning the names of animals eg. goat, goose, peacock. We had a selection of animals to play with and 'feed' with real hay. In number we have been singing number songs and rhymes.











This week in Starfish class, we have been reading Handa's Surprise and looking at fruits and animals. We had all the fruits from the story, some of which the children had not seen before eg. passion fruit. We worked on our vocabulary as we cut them open to feel, smell and talk about them. We talked about which was our favourite fruit and in maths we made a simple chart to show which fruit was the most popular. We looked at the animals and the patterns they have on them. At the mark making table, some children had a go at drawing their own patterns, stripes, spots and shapes.

Seahorse Class



This week, Seahorse Class have continued the theme of Supertato and Superheroes. We began the week by listening to the brand new Supertato book 'Eviltato vs Superpea. We have also listened to Patcho and Pigeon: The Dynamic Duo! Within the stories we have unpicked the vocabulary: hasty, rampage, nemesis, citizens and nitwit.




In Literacy, the children decided on their own superpowers and wrote a sentence about their power. On the mark-making table the children have been creating masks, writing secret notes and designing superhero costumes. We have also listened to and sung a variety of superhero songs, before participating in superhero yoga.



In Maths, we have used our knowledge when subitising to explore number bonds to 10. The children have used double sided counters, ten frames,

part-part-whole mats and interactive whiteboard games to practise different ways to make 10. We have orally used the number sentence "? and ? altogether makes ?"





On Friday, we explored the celebration Mother's Day. We discussed what Mother's Day is and how families celebrate. The children have enjoyed making Mother's Day cards and have tried hard to keep the surprise all week.

Throughout the week, the children have built a castle using the crates, roleplayed as hairdressers, moulded with the Superpea green playdough, and constructed with Mobilo.

Another fantastic week, Year 1. Well done!



This week, Year 3 have been continuing to write their non-chronological reports about Pangolins. It has been fabulous to see how enthusiastic the children have been during their research lessons.


In Maths we are learning about mass and capacity and have been measuring in grams and kilograms.






Curlew Class

Avocet Class




In PE this half term, Year 6 are learning the skills for basketball and the rules to play the game. So far we have learnt the skills of dribbling and movement, as well as playing small team games.

The winners for this half term so far are EYFS/ KS1 Oyster Class, having attendance of 97.78% overall and in KS2 Sanderling Class with 97.22%.




100% Attendance and Punctuality Prize
