Following their fantastic performance at the Palace Theatre a couple of weeks ago, on Tuesday, Year 1 once again showcased their talents. This time it was the lovely residents at Kathryn Court Care Home who were fortunate enough to be their audience.

After performing all their songs, the residents then joined in for one extra one, as it was a class member's birthday that day.

Before leaving school, each child had chosen a book to take with them. Once the singing had ended, they then shared these with the residents and chatted with them.

Finally, everyone joined in with a riotous version of the Hokey Cokey (as it turns out that this IS what it is all about!)

All children behaved impeccably and were a credit to the school.

Turtle and Starfish Class



This week in Nursery, we all had an EGG-cellent time with lots of Easter themed activities. We all danced to the Sleeping Bunnies song and moved in lots of different ways. We all made chocolate Easter cakes using melted chocolate and noticed the way it changed as it cooled and became firm.



In Turtles class, we have been reading 5 Little Easter Bunnies and tried to join in with the repeating parts of the story counting the bunnies. We have finished working together to make a lovely sparkly number line 0 to 5 using cutting and sticking, which is up on display in the room. We looked at numbers one to five on large eggs and sequenced them, and we sang five 'hot cross buns in the bakers shop'. In the tough tray we explored an Easter themed filling and emptying activity with tiny chicks and bunnies. We have also been working on our motor control by using coloured tissue paper to stick

on to an egg shape.







In Starfish class, we have been reading We're Going On An Egg Hunt and we had great fun finding eggs hidden around the garden, using positional vocabulary such as under, behind on top, next to. We learnt about the first Easter and the reason we celebrate Easter through talking about a story about Jesus. For our maths activity, we matched bunnies with the numbers 1 to 10 by counting the amounts of carrots on their tummies. In the tough tray we had cracked eggs to match up with little chicks then later in the week we used tweezers to fill little eggs with pasta shapes, developing our fine motor skills. As a challenge on the writing table, we had dot to dots with numbers up to 20. This helped us to work on our pencil control.







We all had a turn at an Easter egg hunt on the play-deck and would like to say thank you to FOH for our Cracking Easter eggs. We wish you all a wonderful Easter. The Nursery Team



Seahorse Class




Seahorse Class have had a very busy last week of the Spring term. We began the week by learning about the Easter story. We discovered what the cross on a hot cross bun represented, and why eggs symbolise new life. On Tuesday, we took part in Bikeability. The children learnt how to put a helmet on safely, before listening to instructions

This week, we have reached the end of our Polar Explorers topic. The children have enjoyed learning about significant explorers who have travelled to both the North and South Poles. They have also explored the polar habitats and the animals and plants found there. To finish off the topic, we had a D&T day where we designed, made and evaluated our own model igloos. First, we researched how igloos are constructed. The children were interested to discover that there are several different types of igloos used for different purposes. Some igloos are

large enough for up to 20 people to share!



Several of the children had already created their own model igloo as part of their homework this term and they were able to transfer some of the skills involved to their new model. The children enjoyed becoming 'experts' and sharing top tips with their friends.

During the making process, there was a great deal of 'in the moment' problem solving. It was lovely to see the children referring to their design throughout the building process and making adaptations as they went along, both in their

design and in their models.



The end results varied a great deal, each model having its' own unique style. We then took time to reflect on what had worked well and how we would make changes to improve our models the next time we built an igloo.










Heron Class


The children looked in the dictionary to help them find words with the given endings and wrote about their findings.


We also looked at prefixes and whether the words ended in -sure or -ture, as well as investigating words that ended in il.


We have also been preparing for Easter and had a fabulous Easter Egg hunt in the afternoon with the Friends of Hinguar.










Curlew Class

The winners for this half term are EYFS/ KS1 Oyster Class, having attendance of 93.34% overall and in KS2 Sanderling Class with 96.37%.




100% Attendance and Punctuality Prize
