<p>Where is your favourite seaside place to visit? Is it somewhere in Southend like the Sea Life Centre or Adventure Island or somewhere you have visited on holiday? Design a poster so other people know about this place</p>		<p>Collect something pretty or interesting from the beach (e.g. a shell or a small piece of drift wood). Make up a story about what it is and how it got there - use your imagination to make your story magical.</p>

<p>Using a pack of cards, pick 5 and see how many different number sentences you can make using only those 5 numbers. Can you make addition and subtraction sentences?</p>	<p>Try to write your own pirate jokes. Tell them to someone in your family. Can you make them laugh?</p>	<p>Imagine you found a magic key which could take you anywhere you wanted. Write a story about your own Magic Key adventure.</p>
