


The activities listed below are possible homework tasks for you to complete with your child over the term. We ask that you complete no more than 1 activity per week. Completed activities can be brought into class on any day and there will be an opportunity for completed work to be shared as a class or in a small group as part of Circle Time. <p>Create your own story using yourself and your family as the characters? (Adults please feel free to scribe for your child and perhaps encourage your child to draw a picture or copy write the odd word or sentence if they are ready to write.)</p> 	<p>Please read/share a story 5 times a week. This can be recorded in your reading record. Key questions could include: What do you think will happen next? How is the character feeling?</p> 	<p>Design a family tree. Feel free to use photos or drawings. (Adults please feel free to scribe for your child and perhaps encourage your child to copy write the odd word or sentence if they are ready to write).</p> 
<p>Go on an autumn walk with your family in the park or woods and collect a rock. Can you decorate a rock to show your favourite book character or nursery rhyme?</p> 	<p>Find pictures that begin with the letters in your name. Arrange the pictures under each letter in the correct order to spell out your name.</p> 	<p>Go on a sensory walk? What can you See? Hear? Smell? Taste? Touch? Record your findings.</p> 
<p>Go on a shape hunt and record your findings. What shapes have you found? What shapes are your favourite objects?</p> 	<p>Enjoy a board game with your family, practise your counting skills as you play. Take a photo for our Maths area.</p> 	<p>Create a picture of your favourite celebration (fireworks, birthday, Christmas, Diwali, Eid). Use any media you like to create your picture.</p> 
<p>Explore Education City (your child's login details are in their reading record). Do not forget the Literacy and Mathematics activities set once a week to consolidate their learning.</p> 	<p>Design a toothbrush you would want to use. Then, when brushing your teeth, take a picture and bring both into school, so we can make a 'we take care of our teeth' display.</p> 	<p>Talk to a parent or grandparent about their time as a child. Are there any similarities or differences between the food, clothes or toys they had? What was going to school or on holiday like?</p>
