













Seahorse Class Homework Menu Spring Term 2025

The activities listed below are possible homework tasks for you to complete with your child over the term. Completed activities can be brought into class on any day and there will be an opportunity for completed work to be shared as a class. We would recommend that you only complete and send in one activity a week.

<p>Make a puppet of your child's favourite book character. You could use cardboard, fabric, lolly sticks! Have fun!</p>  <p>Can they write a sentence about why they like this character?</p>	<p>Please read/share a story 5 times a week. This can be recorded in your reading record. Key questions can include: What do you think will happen next? How is the character feeling? Can you act the story out?</p> 	<p>When you are talking to your child and planning your week, talk about which day of the week it is, what time you are going out, how long the activity will take etc. Create a diary of events that take place in a typical day.</p> 
<p>Can you create a beanstalk? What resources can you use? How can you measure it?</p>  <p>What will you put at the top of your beanstalk? A castle, the giant, an ogre?</p>	<p>Draw the front cover of their favourite story and bring in with their favourite story to share with the class.</p>  <p>Ask your child to write some sentences describing why this is their favourite story.</p>	<p>Collect objects of different colours in your home. After putting them into their colour category, can you count the objects? Try to write the number of each category.</p> 
<p>Design a poster on how to use a piece of technology – iPad, remote control car, camera, laptop etc.</p>  <p>Write some instructions, including how to use the technology safely.</p>	<p>Can you design and make a mode of transport fit for your favourite character to travel in? Be original and let your imagination run wild!</p> 	<p>Can you find a recipe to match your favourite story? E.g., a Gruffalo crumble, porridge, marmalade sandwich etc. Have a go at making it. What did it taste like? (Adults to try and support with verbal prompts and using the oven only!)</p> 
<p>When walking up the stairs, walking past lampposts, anything you can count encourage your child to count. They will be learning without realising it! Extend their number knowledge by posing questions that need solutions e.g. What if you add 1 more? 1 less? How many more would make 10?</p> 	<p>Use recycled objects to create a dinosaur. Can you create a new name for you dinosaur? Why have you called your dinosaur this name?</p> 	<p>Can you write a fact file on your favourite animal? What is it's natural habitat? What does it eat? What is the male, female and baby called?</p>
