Can you find each of these countries on a world map?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Art</u></b></p> <p>Find objects in your house with reflective surfaces (shiny). Carefully draw them and show the reflected images. Are the reflections the same or have they been distorted by the shape of your objects?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>History</u></b></p> <p>Research a musical instrument from the past and make a fact file about it. (Time period, country of origin, materials used, how it was played etc.)</p>

State the name, author and genre of the book. Listen to examples of music of those styles. Look carefully at shadows and include these in your pictures.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Science (Electricity) – 2<sup>nd</sup> half term</u></b> <b><u>(Cross curricular link with Maths)</u></b></p> <p>How many objects in your house can you find that need electricity to work? Which use batteries, mains electricity or both. Display your results in either a Venn diagram or a Carroll diagram (or both!)</p>
